From the President's Desk

We hope all are enjoying the warm sultry weather of the Lowcountry and the many offerings provided by this wonderfully located community. The Hilton Head Plantation Board is in progress of an effort to "Elevate Board Visibility" and is taking steps to ensure the vitality and residential advantages of living in Hilton Head Plantation are maintained into the future. As such, the Board has chartered two new Ad Hoc committees, which might be of interest, along with a Strategic Planning Committee, which updates our Strategic Plan every two years. The two Ad-Hoc committees include:

Technology Committee Chaired by technology and business veteran Mr. 1. Dave Barnum to work closely with the GM, Assistant GM, and Staff on ways to help support the residential experience with great efficiency for residents and a more manageable workload for our dedicated and talented staff. With approximately 12,000 cars passing through our gates, continuing to seek ways to enhance those transactions is an essential and desired outcome. Please note this is not a new effort but rather one where the POA is leveraging the skills of various Board members and superbly talented staff to seek ways to improve the ease of transactions.

2. The POA is historically known for its fiscal discipline and a focused approach to protecting the revenues generated to maintain a ratable and predictable utilization of funds with minimal debt. This Board has chartered POA Treasurer Ms. Lori Schmidt and the GM and Asst. GM to calibrate on codifying this position as an ongoing operating mantra. This mindset, in existence for more than 20 years under the consistent operating leadership of the GM and staff, has enabled significant upgrades in facilities with minimal debt. Another key point of this effort is to explore cash management opportunities for greater returns and thereby again help keep assessments at an attractive rate. Treasurer Schmidt, with her extensive background in banking and town governments, is ideally suited to help steward this effort.

3. The Board has asked POA VP, Margie Lechowicz, along with the GM and Staff as part of a regularly scheduled review, to execute a refresh of the existing Strategic Plan to ensure the POA continues to be forward looking in meeting a variety of Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats i.e. the routine SWOT analysis. Each of the various POA Committees will play a vital role in this strategic effort. Ms. Lechowicz has extensive experience in leading such efforts and that background, along with expertise residing in the Committees and POA Staff is very promising in solidifying our POA for an exciting future. Scams

With technology growing in leaps and bounds, scammers are pulling out all the stops to part you from your funds, bank accounts, and, in some cases, your identity. Please do not fall prey to emails, text messages, letters, and or phone calls claiming that your accounts have been frozen and that you need to call a phone number to unlock your checking, savings, or credit card accounts. These are all scams, and some folks have been taken for significant funds, thinking they are legitimate.

Another scam is opening an email from what you feel is a trusted source, and when you click on the link, it warns you that your computer has been hacked and you need to call a number to unlock it. The person on the other end, of course, will perform the unlocking service for a fee, which usually involves providing your credit or debit card information. Don't open suspicious emails or give your account information to individuals under such circumstances.

Also included on the list of scams is the old story that a loved one, most often a young relative, has been arrested or lost all their funds while traveling in a foreign country. These folks call and ask you to wire funds to a certain account or purchase gift cards and send them to a particular address so they can get out of jail or have funds to get home. These are scams as well.

With Artificial Intelligence gaining more and more sophistication, you can't even tell if an image of a family member or an acquaintance is real. It only takes hackers a few minutes of recording someone to use their image, voice, and mannerisms to convince you they are the real deal. Never be pressured into giving out your account number, withdrawing cash to send, or purchasing gift cards without verifying the situation is the Real Deal. That means taking the time to call your bank, credit card company, vendor, or person asking for the funds and verifying an actual situation or need.

Too often, the POA Office has received reports of folks being scammed out of significant funds or, in the most severe cases, losing their identity to a hacker. Please take the time to verify, do not open suspicious emails or texts, and when in doubt, call HHP Security or the Beaufort County Sheriff's Office for assistance.

Alligators

Please be mindful of our alligator population. Most alligators have a healthy fear of humans. If you suspect and can identify an alligator demonstrating aggression towards humans, please report it to Security so they can investigate and decide if the alligator is aggressive. If it is found to be aggressive, the alligator will be removed and euthanized. The Department of Natural Resources does not permit aggressive alligators to be relocated. Parents, please do not allow your children to fish or venture near a lagoon without proper adult supervision. We have hundreds of alligators within Hilton Head Plantation, and they were here long before humans arrived on the scene. Please exercise caution and common sense.

Do not harass or feed the alligators. If you feed an alligator, you are sentencing that alligator to death. We do not want alligators to associate humans with food supply. Please pass this information on to your visitors and guests.

If you have an Alligator situation, for example, you find a gator in your open garage, your pool taking a dip, at your front door trying to solicit your attention, or basking in the sun on your driveway or front lawn, don't panic! Call HHP Security at (843) 681-2459. Our Security Officers are trained to move Mr. or Ms. Gator to a lagoon or other natural area.

278 Bridge and Corridor Project

We continue to track this project, hoping that the Town Council will act to provide the measures to move it to the next phase.

Pedestrians and Cyclists

We strongly discourage recreational cyclists from traveling on Whooping Crane Way and Seabrook Drive south of the Dolphin Head Wye. Cycling on these two stretches of busy roadway is dangerous. In a confrontation with a 2000 LB+ vehicle, the bicycle is always going to lose. The cyclist may have the right to be on that stretch of road, but we do not want anyone injured or harmed. For a motorist, it can be frustrating because a bicycle is holding up a column of traffic by not keeping it to the far right of the roadbed. Motorists need to share the road with the cyclists who have a right to be there. Cyclists have an extensive leisure path system, so please use it if you are a recreational biker.

If you are on a bicycle and using our roads, you are subject to the same rules as a motor vehicle. We encourage the use of bicycles and want everyone to share the road and our Leisure Paths safely. Bicycles should travel in the same direction as motor vehicles, while pedestrians should travel against the direction of motor vehicles.

Pine Island Beach Renourishment Permitting

This project now seems to be moving forward once again after being held up by various misunderstandings regarding its scope.

Dolphin Head Rec Center

This is a partial repeat from my May column with a slightly different twist.

A word on courtesy: The new Dolphin Head Rec Building has attracted clubs, classes, and many private rentals. The staff has purchased a sign that should be deployed by clubs, class instructors, and private rental hosts to inform folks just passing by that the building and/or deck are in exclusive use.

Please do not walk into the building's meeting space or deck area while the building is being used by a club, class or for private rental. The staff has received many complaints of folks just walking into the building while the building is being used for a class, by a club, or by a private rental. The Bathrooms are open to property owners and their guests, but when the building and deck are in use, please respect the exclusive use of the meeting hall space and deck. All folks whether using the building or just passing by, should exercise courtesy.

Survey Results

As of the May 31 deadline for submission, we had received well over 1700 surveys. That is almost a 40% participation rate, which is outstanding. We are still tabulating the results and will post all the information on our website, hiltonheadplantation. com, once completed.

Do you know where your children & grandchildren are?

With the warmer weather here and school out for the summer, some young people can get into mischief. Seemingly harmless pranks and others that are downright destructive and dangerous can quickly escalate. Such activities include but are not limited to ringing doorbells and running away, egging or toilet papering homes or vehicles, damaging mailboxes, and trespassing on golf courses or POA property in an unauthorized manner. On occasion, young people have donned camouflage gear and carried realistic looking pellet and BB guns, removing, or painting the orange plastic tip that may be the only thing that distinguishes the weapon from the real deal at a distance.

All these situations are destructive, dangerous, and potentially lethal as individuals encountering such behavior and/or situations may overreact. Many property owners have legal firearms in their homes. Please talk with your children and grandchildren about such behavior and potentially placing themselves in harm's way. Back in the day, an old New York City TV Station asked during evening commercial breaks, "Do you know where your children are?" If you encounter such activity, please call Security at 843-681-2459.

Hurricane Season

Hurricane season is here. Please check out the Hurricane Preparedness information on our website, hiltonheadplantation. com. You can find this valuable information under the Security button on the main page of the site. Hard copies of the Hilton Head Plantation Hurricane Preparedness Guide are available at the POA Office. Several updates have been made to the Guide based on our experience with recent storms, so please secure an updated copy of this important document. We learned several valuable lessons from Hurricanes Dorian, Irma, and Matthew. The most critical lesson is: Do not expect or depend on the State or the Federal government to do everything for you immediately following a hurricane. These government agencies should be focused on the most needy and vulnerable in our community. As we all know all too well, if we are (God forbid) hit with a hurricane again, those who are able must be as self-sufficient as possible for as long as possible. Our threefold communication approach worked well (HHP website, email blasts, and 800 number Hurricane Hot Line. Flooding, which has always been depicted on our hurricane category maps, is a reality, and every storm is different. That means proper preparation, adequate food, clothing, and medical supplies for you and your family. Please read over the guide and prepare accordingly.

Please jot down this special 800 number that has been set up for HHP residents and keep it with your hurricane evacuation kit: 1-877-264-5267. We have set up this number to dispense hurricane evacuation and re-entry information. Being prepared is key, so please take a few moments to review the information available on our website and prepare your household.

Irrigation Systems

Please use your home irrigation systems responsibly. 40-50% of our potable water goes toward landscaping irrigation. Please use irrigation for landscaping sparingly and consider turning off your irrigation system during rainfall or installing a rain sensor that will automatically turn off your system when there is sufficient natural rainfall.

Just a reminder that HHP has three lined Pickleball hard courts located in the Dolphin Head rec area. These courts can be used both first come, first served or by reserving the courts through the Tennis Pro Shop.

"Harry G, Heron" Master Covenants Bird

This month's focus: To Agree to Disagree, property Maintenace, How to handle houseguests and Harry's "Harp of the Month!"



Greetings, bipedal friends I am Harry, a feathered voyager of the skies, a master fisherman, and a keen observer of the human condition. I spread my wings over your bustling community, watching your interactions from a bird's eye view. So, this month, I share my erudite thoughts on a curious human phenomenon, agreeing to disagree. Now, I must confess, we herons do not have much use for this concept in our day-to-day lives. After all, while humans are having a kerfuffle over a prime fishing spot, for us herons it is

usually the one with the quickest and sharpest beak who gets the fish. But in your complex human societies, with your myriads of opinions and ideas, I have noticed that this ability to agree to disagree is a crucial part of your social fabric.

It is a fascinating notion, really. The idea that you can lock beaks over an issue, exchange passionate words, and yet, at the end of it all, step back and acknowledge the validity of each other's perspectives. It is akin to two birds flying in different directions yet respecting each other's chosen paths. So, settle in, featherless friends, as we explore this intriguing aspect of your human discourse. Just remember, these insights come from a humble heron. But who knows? Perhaps a bird's eye view is just what you need to fully appreciate the beauty of agreeing to disagree.

The phrase "agree to disagree" is often used in discourse and debates where two or more parties have different opinions, views, or beliefs that they cannot reconcile. Still, they decide to move on without trying to convince the other party to change their stance. The concept is based on mutual respect for other people's perspectives and the understanding that it is okay to have differing opinions. It is common for residents to have varying opinions on the rules and regulations. Some might agree with all the policies, while others might have reservations. However, it is important to note that rules and regulations in our community are established for the welfare of all residents. They are not merely individual opinions; they are collective agreements that aim to ensure harmony, safety, and mutual respect.

Harry, how come POA maintenance does not clean unkempt properties and charge the property owner a fee?

While it may seem expedient for the POA Staff to step in and clean up properties that are not in compliance, there are several sound reasons why this is not typically done. Cleaning up non-compliant properties will incur costs for the POA. Such a tactic is a method of last resort and is fraught with issues, including sustaining labor, equipment, attorney, and disposal fees, oftentimes without any hope of finding reimbursement. Liability is a major factor, as the property owner can claim damages. These costs will be passed on to all homeowners through increased dues or assessments. The POA has enforcement procedures in place to address non-compliance issues. These procedures include warnings, fines, and other actions of which many of my human friends may not be aware. Then there is the "Wrath of Harry". Harry is an easy-going, compliant, and parsimonious bird. Still, when Harry's feathers get out of sorts after all else has failed to bring about appropriate compliance, Harry does have his own means. While it may be tempting for the POA to take direct action on non-compliant properties, there are legal, privacy, cost, and community dynamics to consider. The POA's Human Staff are typically designated to enforce rules and regulations through established procedures rather than taking direct action on individual properties. Yours truly, on the other hand, is.... well... not human.

Harry, I will have family members here for the summer. Are they allowed to swim at the Spring Lake Pool and to fish the lagoons?

Summer is here, and family members are arriving for their summer visit. Guest passes are issued to visitors for the specific purpose of visiting a resident at their residential property. House guest cards were established to provide residents' guests access to HHP facilities without the requirement of being accompanied by the property owner. Each person with a house guest card who is 17 years or older may bring two (2) additional guests with them for a total of three people per card. Children 16 years old or younger may not bring guests to the pool and other HHP facilities. The house guest cards are required at Spring Lake Tennis Recreation area, Leisure Paths and Trails, Whooping Crane Conservancy, Dolphin Head Recreation area, POA Fishing Lagoons, Pine Island Beach, Hickory Forest Boardwalk, and Spring Lake Pool. When fishing, residents 13 years of age and older provide appropriate identification as a property owner or house guest of Hilton Head Plantation. Guest passes are issued to visitors for the specific purpose of visiting a resident at their residential property. Persons desiring to fish in our lagoons are urged to obtain a map designating which are HHPPOA-owned and which are privately owned by regimes within the community or by a golf course. Maps are available at the POA Service Center for \$2.

Harry's Harp of the Month!

Harry, some of the residents at Canine Park do not have control over their dogs.

When entering the dog park, the dogs must be properly socialized. Aggressive behavior towards other dogs or people is not permitted. Dogs must be supervised, and owners should always have control. Owners should not have their dogs unattended in the park. Dogs must be on a leash when entering and exiting the vehicle at the park to prevent incidents and ensure the safety of all dogs and owners. Once inside the designated off-leash area, dogs may be unleashed if they are under control. Rapscallion dogs are not allowed. Dogs with aggressive behavior towards other dogs or people should not be brought to the park. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs by promptly picking up and properly disposing of their waste. By following these rules and guidelines, owners can help ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all the dog owners at the dog park.

So, let us continue to engage in perspicacious dialogue, to question and challenge, to share and listen. Let us strive to understand, and even when we take umbrage, mutual respect is the outcome. It is through this process of agreeing to disagree that we strengthen the bonds of our community, foster a culture of inclusivity, and contribute to an environment where every voice matters. In the spirit of camaraderie and mutual respect, let us, at times, agree to disagree.

Spring Lake Pool Rules and Hours

2024 Spring Lake Pool Rules

Swimmers assume responsibility for their own safety and that of their families. Lifeguards will not be on duty during all hours that the pool is open. The pool is equipped with a self-locking gate, an emergency telephone, and a first aid kit at the Guard Office. Report problems to Security – 843-681-2459. Also, DHEC will inspect for fecal contamination and other violations. If DHEC finds any contamination, they will close the pool immediately. Please be courteous and if you have a child that is NOT potty-trained, he/she MUST wear a secure-fitting, waterproof swim diaper at all times. For questions, please contact the Director of Activities at 843-681-8800, ext. 226. Thank you for your cooperation.

Spring Lake Pool Regulations

- 1. HHP Property Owners, their family members, guests, and tenants with leases of at least nine months may use SL Pool.
- 2. Spring Lake Pool users must present their validated HHP Photo ID Card to the pool staff when using the facility.
- 3. Property Owners, residents, and children 17 years and older, with validated HHP Photo ID Cards, may bring four (4) guests to the pool. Children 16 years old, with a validated HHP Photo ID Card, may enter the Spring Lake Pool; however, they are prohibited from bringing guests.
- 4. Guests, 17 years or older, with a validated House Guest Card may bring two (2) guests.
- Spring Lake Pool users and their guests must adhere to a proper code of conduct and follow instructions from the lifeguards and pool attendants

Appropriate conduct and rules include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 6. Lifeguard approval of all flotation devices. (Flotation devices must be Coast Guard approved.)
- 7. Using earphones with audio equipment.
- 8. Placing trash in receptacles.
- 9. Smoking is not permitted within the Spring Lake Pool compound at any time. (This includes e-cigarettes.)
- 10. Wearing swim-wear at all times.
- 11. Showering prior to entering the pool.
- 12. Children age 15 years or younger MUST be accompanied by a parent or guardian (17 or older).
- 13. It is the parent's/guardian's responsibility to ensure that children not potty-trained must wear secure-fitting, waterproof swim diapers at all times. NOTE: Anyone found responsible for a fecal contamination at the Spring Lake Pool will be held accountable for the cost of treatment and be subject to additional sanctions. If the person responsible is not a property owner, the cost of treatment and other sanctions will be levied against the host Property Owner/resident.
- 14. The following is prohibited in the Spring Lake Pool enclosure:
- No solo swimming.
- No animals or pets of any kind.
- No glass containers.
- No spitting, blowing nose, or individuals with skin, eye, ear, or respiratory infections, diarrhea illness, or nausea.
- No diaper changing on deck.
- No bikes, skateboards, skates, or Rollerblades.
- No diving.

- No one with communicable diseases.
- No one with open lesions or wounds.
- No running, boisterous, rough play.
- No alcohol or drugs and no one under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- No rings, body floats, rafts, and other such devices.
- 15. In the zero-depth area of the pool, infants will be permitted to use a baby ring as space dictates but they MUST be under direct supervision of a parent/guardian at all times.
- 16. Safety breaks will be called at the discretion of the lifeguards.
- 17. Pool noodles are permitted but they are to be used for flotation only.
- Coolers are permitted but they are subject to inspection. All food and / or drinks must be kept at least ten (10) feet from the edge of the pool. Alcohol is NOT permitted.
- 19. No climbing is allowed on the island in the middle of the lazy river.
- 20. Children wearing Coast Guard approved flotation devices in the lazy river or the deep-end area of the pool.
- 21. MUST be accompanied by a parent/guardian at all times.
- 22. Spring Lake Pool may not be used for personal profit or commercial purposes.
- 23. Lounge chairs, cabanas, tables and other pool equipment may not be reserved. They may be used on a first come, first served basis. Property owners and guests should not leave personal items unattended. The HHPPOA accepts NO responsibility for any item left unattended.
- 24. Lifeguards and pool attendants have the authority to expel violators. They may also create and enforce other safety rules, as necessary.

- Advanced Level: 4.0 to 4.5 Level Advanced players have an elevated level of skill and experience, often competing in tournaments and leagues.
- Elite Level: 5.0 to 5.5 Level Elite players stand at the pinnacle of pickleball skill and athleticism, competing at the highest levels.
- Professional Level: 5.5 to 7.0 Level Professional players earn a living through sponsorships, endorsements, and prize money from competitive tournaments.

No matter your current skill level, pickleball offers a welcoming and inclusive community where players of all abilities can enjoy the thrill of competition and camaraderie.

WOODCARVERS

Are you looking for a hobby that allows you to create beautiful keepsakes or practical items without spending hundreds of dollars just on getting started? Wood carving checks all of those boxes. It is a type of woodworking in which people use knives, chisels, and other hand-held wood carving tools to create figures or designs in pieces of wood. A wood carver's most basic tools are carving knives, such as whittling knives, chip carving knives, and hook knives.

Whittling knives are all-purpose tools, while chip carving knives feature a thin, short blade that allows carvers to chip away small bits of wood. A hook knife, or spoon knife, has a bent blade shaped like a hook and is ideal for carving spoons and other pieces with hollowed-out areas. Most woodcarvers start by whittling. They find a small piece of softwood and use a pocket knife to create a toy or a trinket. Whittling is the most basic type of wood carving since the only essential tools are a wood carving knife and a honing strop. Chip carving starts with a flat piece of wood. Carvers "chip away" bits of wood to form a design on the wood's surface. Chip carvers use gouges as well as carving knives. Most woodcarvers do not build or repair furniture. They work on a much smaller scale.

To kick off the season, the September meeting will be our annual Low Country Boil. However, here will be plenty of fishing activity during the summer to keep us busy. Kids Kamp fishing starts on June 17th! That will keep us busy on Mondays and Wednesdays for the following eight weeks. Have you signed up to help? If you are uncertain about your capability to assist the youngsters, stop by Seabrook Lagoon some morning and watch what goes on. It's work, it's fun, and it's a great service to the Plantation.

Club members who do salt-water fishing from shore or in-shore waters are well aware of Hilton Head's tidal activity and the magnitude of the tidal range between highs and lows. You dare not wander up a small creek and miss the timing of the approaching low tide. It's a

long time to spend looking at marsh grass until enough water returns to move again. Why do we have so big a difference in water level during a six-hour tidal change? The sketch above covers the "Georgia Bight"-a curved coastline from Cape Fear, North Carolina to Cape Canaveral, Florida. Our part of that coastline is about as far west as you can be in the Atlantic Ocean.



A north-south line from the North Carolina Outer Banks to the Florida Keys and Bahamas covers a distance of about 700 miles. The tidal range at the ends of this line is about two feet. Another north-south line drawn through Hilton Head intersects the Florida coast around Daytona, Florida, about 200 miles distant.

As the tide moves in, 700 miles worth of water gets squeezed into those 200 miles by the shape of the Bight. The only place the water can go is up, sometimes rising as much as eleven feet, flooding the marshes, and providing a place for sea life to hide from predators and to reproduce and multiply, This large tidal range is part of what makes this area such a great place for salt water fishing.



Turtle Nesting Season Has Arrived!



Have you seen it yet? Have you seen the first sea turtle nest on Pine Island in over a year? Recently, a female loggerhead sea turtle dragged her 300-pound body out of the Port Royal Sound using her front flippers. She found a nesting spot on dry sand

above the high tide line on Pine Island. She dug a two-foot-deep hole with her rear flippers, then laid approximately 120 eggs into that nest cavity. She covered the hole with sand, and she went back to the water. She will not return to her nest; she will let the warm summer sun incubate her eggs for about 60 days. The nest is now marked off for safety. We hope that at least one of her hatchlings from approximately 5 nests that she will lay during this 2024 season will return to our area to nest in 30 years or so.

The discovery of this nest was a testament to the dedication of a Sea Turtle Patrol HHI volunteer. Every day, these volunteers walk HHP's two nesting beaches, Pine Island and Hickory Forest, in their mission to monitor all sea turtle nests on Hilton Head Plantation. They are the sole organization on HHI with a permit from SCDNR for this crucial task.

Keep an eye out for more nests as you walk on HHP's beautiful Pine Island! Please visit our website, seaturtlepatrolhhi.org, and consider attending one of our Free Public Turtle Talks at Lowcountry Celebration Park on Mondays in June, July, and August at 8 pm.




