July 13, 2020

OPENING:

Audrey King called the meeting to order at 10:01 AM at the Plantation House.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Bob Huisman motioned to approve the Minutes of June 4th, 2020, as presented. Mary Wilcox seconded, and the motion was passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Audrey opened the floor for discussion regarding the Strategic Plan for 2022-2026.
 Various committee members added input and a first draft was created.
- Chrissy provided an overview of Kids Kamp, the Spring Lake Pool, the July 4th HHP Day Celebration, and the first Deas-Guyz Concert.
- o Chrissy presented the 6-month Activities Calendar.

SUBCOMMITEE LIAISONS:

- o Activities: Chrissy Kristian
 - o Chrissy reported that Kids Kamp is still very busy averaging 120 kids per day.
 - The July 4th HHP Day went very well despite the lower turnout which was to be expected. We only had 17 participants in the patriotic parade, 7 participants in the watermelon eating contest and 5 in the pie eating contest.
 - LeAnn Kalita's art classes have resumed on Thursdays at the Plantation House, and those will continue through the end of July.
 - The first Deas-Guyz Concert was moved to the rain date of Thursday, July 9. The concert ended a little early due to the rain, but the band will add 30 minutes to the next concert to make up for it. The next Deas-Guyz Concert is scheduled for July 21 (rain date July 22).
 - We are still utilizing the 2-hour time slots at the Spring Lake Pool with 30-minute clean breaks in between. Because we haven't hit the maximum number of 150 people at one time, we have decided to allow residents to attend as many 2-hour time slots per day as they wish.
 - The Teen/Tween event for this year will be a horseback riding adventure with Lawton Stables. It is scheduled for Wednesday, July 29, with a rain date set for Monday, August 3.
 - o Annual Cleaning Week for the facilities is scheduled for the week of August 17-21.

- We have two virtual presentations scheduled for the end of August. Hargray's "It's All About the Internet" Seminar was rescheduled as a Zoom presentation for Tuesday, August 25, at 10:00 AM. The "Uncharted Waters in the Stock Market" Webinar with Edward Jones reps is scheduled for Thursday, August 27, at 10:00 AM.
- o Tennis: Keith Ferda (absent)
 - Nothing to report at this time.
- o Fishing / Lagoons: Earle Nirmaier / Dave Morse
 - o Earle reported that there have been no activities with the Fishing Club.
 - Earle shared that the fish are looking for cooler temperatures and staying deep in the middle of the lagoons.
 - Lastly, Earle added that they have several DNR certified instructors within the Fishing Club that help with statewide "fishing rodeos" but all those DNR programs have been cancelled.
- Volunteer Program: Margita Rockstroh / Mary Wilcox
 - o Nothing to report at this time.
 - Chrissy added that we were grateful for all of the volunteers who came to help us with the July 4th – HHP Day Celebration. We could not have held the event without them.
- o Memorial Program / Softball: Bob Huisman / Steve Large (absent)
 - o Bob reported that the Softball Club is still practicing on Mondays.
 - o Bob also added that Sun City still isn't allowing visitors at this time.
 - o Bob then shared that they are trying to get a game organized with the team from Skidaway Island.
 - Chrissy added that we have ordered two new benches for property owners within
 the last few weeks. One will be added under the Talbird Oak by the Cypress –
 along the leisure path. The other will be added along the leisure path between
 Deerfield Road and Whitetail Deer Lane.
- o Bocce Ball / Shuffleboard: Richard Dugan / George Haley (absent)
 - Richard reported that he emailed Kim (Bocce Club President) to find out if anything was planned for the fall. Registration should begin in August if they decide to move forward but not much is going on for the time being.
- Miscellaneous: Peter Kristian
 - o Peter shared that we currently have paving work being done to Oyster Reef Drive.
 - Peter added that the road reflectors still need to be added to the section of Seabrook Drive that was just completed.
 - O Peter reported that some residents are voicing their concerns regarding HHP offering special events like the July 4th HHP Day Celebration and the outdoor concerts. Peter indicated that Margie, Jen and Chrissy are all working very diligently to safely adapt programs to the present coronavirus situation. These individuals should be recognized for their extraordinary efforts to provide a sense of normalcy to the HHP community.
 - o Peter reminded us that hurricane season is upon us.
 - The Deerfield Road drainage project will be starting soon. This project affects eight homes along Deerfield Road.
 - o Peter added that crime continues to be very low.
 - o Staff and Security continue to come into work, and no one has fallen ill.
 - Peter then reported that the Board of Directors has authorized a small committee to work on the survey questions for the possible name change to Hilton Head Plantation. Those survey questions will most likely be sent out to residents at the end of the summer.
 - o Peter finished by sharing that the Covenants Committee discussed the topic of ebikes and electric scooters at their most recent meeting but the members had a tied

vote (which means it failed), and we still will not allow them even though the Town of HHI does allow them on their leisure paths. Several members were opposed because of the high foot traffic on the leisure paths with dog-walkers and

bicyclists, and we have an elderly population that may be slower to react to something electric on the paths.

Margita Rockstroh motioned to adjourn. Bob Huisman seconded, and the motion was passed unanimously.
